


Catholic Leadership Institute Financials

When looking at Catholic Leadership Institute's annual revenue, expenses, and change in net assets it is important to understand our process for delivering ministry across the Catholic Church. To ensure we can deliver on our commitments to each priest, bishop, diocese or parish, we secure the funding necessary before committing to the project. Therefore, for any particular project, revenue is counted in the fiscal year in which it is received but may be recognized as an expense in a subsequent year or years. So, in years where there is a negative change in net assets, it is a planned outcome and one that is evidence of our process for funding and committing to our various ministries. Alternatively, in years with positive change in net assets, this is the result of securing the necessary revenue in advance of committing to the project and realizing the expenses related to that project.




Servant Leaders
